## Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design

Wild roses or old species of Barberry plants are part of a new strategy to prevent people from "hanging out" and / or committing crimes in strategic areas of Sudbury. This is in response to an older man assaulted and left for dead on the green stairs - Ste Anne's Rd. in 2006. The picky plants will dissuade lurking, while obtaining a clean, beautiful, and safe environment where criminals will not linger.

We are grateful for the expert recommendations from Enzo Floreani, James St.John and the collaboration of the Horticultural Society members in their donations of plants towards this project. We are requesting the donation of Wild Roses, old species of Barberry plants or other thorny plants that do not require much attention. They will be planted on the mountain side. Should your members be thinning out the plants, we will gladly accept them. They can be dropped off at 180 Brébeuf Ave.-near Marymount and Notre Dame College, or call 674-1212 for pick up, from now until the end of June.

We thank you very much, and will keep you apprised of our progress.


## **Market Square Activities**
